He wants to find his Enlightenment, and this major conflict set the theme of the piece

Govinda

He relied a lot on Siddhartha to find his own Enlightenment, but then Siddhartha left Govinda alone to learn from the Buddha

Siddhartha vs. Son

His son wants to live on his own, but Siddhartha wants to continue on the path of Enlightenment
